¹The word of the Lord came to me: ²"Son of man, speak to your people and say to them, 'I will bring the sword upon a land, and the people of the land take a man from among them, a watchman, ³and if he sees the sword coming upon the land and blows the trumpet to warn the people, ⁴then if anyone who hears the sound of the trumpet does not take warning, the sword comes and takes him away, his blood shall be upon his own head. ⁵He who hears the sound of the trumpet and did not take warning; his blood shall be upon himself. 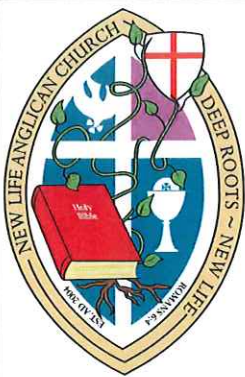
