First Reading 2 Kings 4:8-21, 32-37

Lector: A Reading from the book of 2 Kings.

⁸ One day Elisha went on to Shunem, where a wealthy woman lived, who urged him to eat some food. So whenever he passed that way, he would turn in there to eat food. ⁹ And she said to her husband, "Behold now, I know that this is a holy man of God who is continually passing our way. ¹⁰ Let us make a small room on the roof with walls and put there for him a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp, so that whenever he comes to us, he can go in there." ¹¹ One day he came there, and he turned into the chamber and rested there. ¹² And he said to Gehazi his servant, "Call this Shunammite." When he had called her, she stood before him. ¹³ And he said to him, "Say now to her, 'See, you have taken all this trouble for us; what is to be done for you? Would you have a word spoken on your behalf to the king or to the commander of the army?'" She answered, "I dwell among my own people." ¹⁴ And he said, "What then is to be done for her?" Gehazi answered, "Well, she has no son, and her husband is

old.”¹⁵ He said, “Call her.” And when he had called her, she stood in the doorway.¹⁶ And he said, “At this season, about this time next year, you shall embrace a son.” And she said, “No, my lord, O man of God; do not lie to your servant.”¹⁷ But the woman conceived, and she bore a son about that time the following spring, as Elisha had said to her.¹⁸ When the child had grown, he went out one day to his father among the reapers.¹⁹ And he said to his father, “Oh, my head, my head!” The father said to his servant, “Carry him to his mother.”²⁰ And when he had lifted him and brought him to his mother, the child sat on her lap till noon, and then he died.²¹ And she went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God and shut the door behind him and went out.²² When Elisha came into the house, he saw the child lying dead on his bed.²³ So he went in and shut the door behind the two of them and prayed to the Lord.²⁴ Then he went up and lay on the child, putting his mouth on his mouth, his eyes on his eyes, and his hands on his hands. And as he stretched himself upon him, the flesh of the child became warm.²⁵ Then he got up again and walked once back and forth in the house, and went up and stretched himself upon him. The child sneezed seven times, and the child opened his eyes.²⁶ Then he summoned Gehazi and said, “Call this Shunammite.” So he called her. And when she came to him, he said, “Pick up your son.”²⁷ She came and fell at his feet, bowing to the ground. Then she picked up her son and went out.

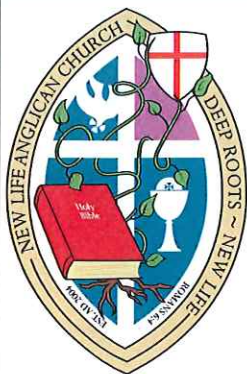
