Third, a Christian is justified. "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we God through our Lord Jesus Christ." erase the mark, withdraw the Spirit, cancel the deposit, break his promise, rev keep the inheritance, forgo the praise, and lessen his glory.

Houdmann concludes that the Christian cannot lose salvation because, in ormany things would have to happen that aren't in God's character to allow irrevocable. A Christian cannot be un-newly created. The redeemed cannot Eternal life cannot be temporary. God cannot renege on his word. Scripture say lie (Titus 1:2)."

He then closes with the following reassuring scripture, "Now to him who is abstumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and all time and now and forever. Amen." (Jude 24-25) (Emphasis mine)

In short, I think S. Michael Houdmann gives a good treatment to the topic of edoes the same for many other topics which you have certainly either wonder asked about. 
