

We will glorify God by deepening the roots of our Anglican faith, and bringing people to new life in Jesus Christ.

It can be easy to see new things in the church and not really know how or when they happened. We have a great group of people who do a ton of things around the church to make sure that things are done, and all the odds and ends are taken care of. Among those who do a lot of work is our vestry (they are by far not the only ones, though). The vestry has been hard

at work these past six months or so addressing building issues that needed to be addressed. As a vestry, we want to be transparent with what we are doing and will be doing, so I wanted to write a short list of some of the projects that have either been completed or are in the works.



First is the new sign and landscaping. It is hard to miss the beautiful new sign that adorns our front lawn. It is more substantial and long-term than the previous sign. The first sign we had lasted us about ten years, but really deteriorated due to weather. This new sign is very sturdy and should last as long as we have the church. With the sign is the new landscaping. You will notice that trees have been moved, flowers have been planted in new places, and all-around things are very beautiful, but very different. The trees in front of the women's bathroom windows were removed because they were getting too big. Everything else was done to accompany the new sign and highlight its looks. We also plan on putting a

little bench in on the west side of the church where people can sit and pray or meditate on scripture or the like.

Another big change has been with the lighting. This change started over a year ago when Dan Wandrie changed all the ballasts in the annex building and set the lights up to be LED. This means, among other things, that there is no hum from the fixtures when they are turned on. They also last a long time and are more energy efficient. Dan planned to do the lights in the main building, but the ceilings are too high. So, we contracted an electric company to come finish the job. They set Blanz Hall up with LEDs, added some light switches, and added some lighting in the kitchen, such as the lights over the passthrough. They also did the biggest job of all; they changed out the lights in the sanctuary and nave of the church. You will notice that it is much brighter now, which was something we desperately needed. All the floodlight type lights in the upstairs of the church are now LED. We no longer have burned out bulbs, and the lights are on new slider-type dimmer switches. The only downside is that now the lights are all on separate switches at the front of the church and can't be turned off and on all at once from the switch in the back of the church. The switch at the back of the church still functions for the four globe lights which have also been updated to LED bulbs, but are not dimmable. Continued on page 4

In previous July articles I on have focused blessings of our country's founding. Often I have referenced books such as "One Nation Under God" and "America's God and Country." Both these books point to Christian ideals influenced the making of this nation. Since that has been covered in several July articles, I would like to



I receive World magazine and often read the World opinion articles which I receive via email. Several months ago an opinion article discussed Christian Nationalism which is a term I had never previously heard. Then the most recent World magazine's had on it's cover page: "The Debate Over Christiaan Nationalism; What's behind the political philosophy riling the left and dividing the right?"

It was not until I read the article that I began to have some understanding of what this phrase or philosophy was about. Here is a quote from the magazine: "Christian nationalists in America believe that the country was founded as a Christian nation and that Christian values should be prioritized throughout government and public life..." Further in the article, I learned that its meaning is actually very fluid and that it can be used to defend all sorts of governmental structures in support of Christianity. As for the left, it has taken on anything that disparages Christianity.

As I read more I began to wonder if I would identify with this belief. As I have written previously, I do believe that this country's foundations are largely due to Judeo-Christian principles. I also hope that those same principals would guide the decisions of those in governmental positions. So, am I a Christian nationalist? It's also possible that many other believers may ask this same question as they become exposed to this philosophy. And that is the reason for this article.

The more I thought about it the more I realized that should I identify as a "Christian Nationalist" I would by compromising what I hold most dear. My faith is not a modifier to my political identity. I am a Christian whose focus is on Christ and that focus is not qualified by my feelings about this nation. My Judeo-Christian belief is not in anyway dependent on anything other than the God of the Bible. If I were to answer in the affirmative to the question regarding Christian nationalism, I would be identifying one with the other. To me that would move into the realm of idolatry by supplanting our faith with another title. Continued on page 4

Christianity and those that call themselves Christians are under attack in today's culture. Those that still identify with the faith of our fathers are being threatened with loss of employment and friends.

The temptation to alter identity with something less contrary to today's progressive ideas may seem safe but it is not. Christian nationalism is a means by which our focus turns away from the God of the Bible and back to ourselves. It is a means in which one's focus is not on the eternal but on the present.

It seems to me that Paul's instructions to Timothy can be applied to many of the threats Christians face and are therefore words to remember. "O Timothy, guard the deposit entrusted to you. Avoid the irreverent babble and contradictions of what is falsely called "knowledge," for by professing it some have swerved from the faith." (I Timothy 6:20-21) ~ Wally's Gallery

You may have noticed that we have some basins sitting on some pews by the west windows of the church. That is because we have a leak in the roof that acts up when the rain is particularly heavy. We had a roofer come look at it. He patched a sizeable hole in the roof and is coming in July to do a permanent fix. The east side has a small leak in roughly the same spot, but it only leaks a tiny bit. The hope is to get all of that fixed. The roofer said that the roof has six to eight more years of life in it, in his opinion, so we don't need to replace the entire roof. Fixing the leaky parts is sufficient. Related to the roof are the two trees on the west side of the building. They overhang the roof right where it is leaking, so for protection for the roof, we had those trees removed.

There are two other projects that we have been trying to work on for months, but getting contractors this time of year has proven difficult. The first is that the floor around the toilet in the bathroom connected to my office is rotted out and needs to be replaced. We have a contractor coming in mid-July to look at it and hopefully it will be done shortly after that. We also have cracked and crumbling steps around the pillars at the entrance to the church. We have been working on getting them patched, but, again, the hold-up is finding a contractor with the time to do it. So, we don't have a time frame on when that will be done, but rest assured, it is being worked on.

There may be other projects that I am forgetting about, and there will certainly be new ones down the road as is common with owning a building. I just wanted to write this brief update to let you know what things the vestry has been up to and to let you know what work is being done around the church.
